

The following Charges are provided with our **Standing Contract** for single-rate, two-rate (with controlled load) & time-of-use offers for **Domestic** and **Small Business Customers** electricity sites within the Ausnet Services distribution area based on the applicable network tariff and metering configuration.

Comparison to VDO: A **representative domestic customer (without controlled load)** to whom the single rate or time of use rate applies and who consumes 4,000 kWh per year from the grid will pay \$1,748 including GST (without controlled load), that is equal to the VDO*. Your bill will differ based on your actual usage.

Comparison to VDO: A **representative small business customer** on a single rate offer who consumes 10,000 kWh per year from the grid will pay \$3,896 (without controlled load), that is equal to the VDO. Your bill will differ based on your actual usage.

Controlled Load eligibility and hours of operation are as set by your Distributor.

Daily supply charge: a charge that applies for supplying electricity to your property for each day of the billing period, regardless of how much electricity you use.

Domestic customer: a customer who purchases electricity principally for personal, household or domestic use

kWh: a 'kWh' stands for kilowatt hour and is the unit of measurement for your electricity usage.

Small business customer: a customer who is not a domestic customer and whose aggregate consumption of electricity is not more than 40 MWh per annum

***VDO**

Electricity plans must be compared to the Victorian Default Offer (VDO), set each year by the Essential Services Commission to make it easier to compare energy plans across the market in each region. The VDO is calculated based on an average usage customer in this region and does not include conditional discounts, solar feed-in credits, concessions / rebates or other fees. Your actual energy bill may be significantly different and will depend on your actual electricity usage, when you use electricity and if you have solar.
